
Starting Your Second Year



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Winter

- Open entrance/ventilation
- Remove dead bees







Feeding

- In cold weather try to check hive weight
- If bees are breaking cluster, you can add food (if needed)
 - Honey bank recommended
 - Solid emergency food if needed (liquid food in 50F+)
 - Feed as growth stimulant
 - Opinions or approaches to feeding



What Killed My Bees

- Find out if you should do something different
- Different bee race?
- Different hardware setup?
- History review/Planning ahead
- Order live bees as early as possible




Cleaning

- As you take dead hives down, check for diseases (last talk today)
- In most cases you can re-use your combs and boxes
- Spring cleaning time
 - Remove burr comb and propolis
 - Replace old comb (4 5 years)
 - Remove dead bees
 - Scratch capped brood (for faster removal by bees)

Relocating Hives

More than 3 miles or less than 2 feet



Queens

- 2015, the year of the bad queens
 - Even known good queen producers made bad queens
 - Some queens didn't last for at least one season
- 2016, the year you should start making your own
 - Can't be worst than the purchased ones
 - Lower cost
 - Each year genetics improve
